This is a pub that even the most provincial Trappist monk would find cozy. The Old Monk offers draft beers from England, Ireland, Germany and Belgium, and around 70 bottled beers. Probably thanks to its close proximity to a bunch of antique stores, it's festooned with lights from a Pennsylvania monastery, a back-bar from an English chemist's shop and a roughly hundred-year-old altar door.
